The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the faithful and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Shroud is one of the most scientifically studied religious icons in history. As science has progressed, so has the speculation on how the image of the crucified man of the Shroud was made.

The exhibit includes a detailed photograph of the Shroud specially produced by the Eastman Kodak. The image is more than 14 feet long and 3 feet wide and shows the front and back images of the shroud. The exhibit presents the results of a comprehensive scientific and forensic study with numerous photographs and illustrations. The exhibit is the work of the Center for the Study of the Passion of Christ and the Holy Shroud and Monsignor Giulio Ricci and other scientists, who spent more than 25 years researching the Holy Shroud.
